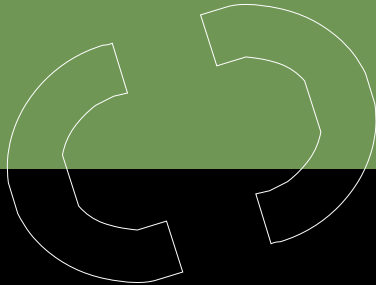

# Why Malta?

- Skilled, Multilingual and comparatively low-cost workforce;
- Strategic Geographical Location;
- EU Membership – Malta's accession to the EU has ensured that remote gaming operators licensed in Malta are granted access to the EU internal market and, in particular, the freedom to provide cross-border services within the EU;
- Easily accessible, high-tech and competitively-priced co-location facilities;
- Expedient licensing process.

## LOW COST

- Inexpensive Application Fees – All classes of Remote Gaming Licence – approx. EUR 2,330;
- Low Operating Licence Costs – All classes of Remote Gaming Licence – approx. EUR 8,500 per annum;
- Competitive Corporate Taxation – Effective Tax Rate as low as 5%;
- Low Gaming Taxation: Depending on the Class Licence, gaming tax is calculated as follows:

Class 1 – EUR 7000 per month

Operating on a Class 4 Licence, EUR 1200 per month;

Class 2 and Class 2 on 4 – 0.5% on gross amount of stakes accepted;

Class 3 and Class 3 on 4 – 5% of Real Income

Class 4 – Licence Fee – Tax exemption for the first six months,

Licence Fee – six month up to first year of operation – EUR 2330 per month,

Licence Fee – After first year of operation – EUR 4660 per month.

- The total maximum of tax payable per annum by one licensee in respect of any one licence shall not exceed EUR 466,000 per annum.

## MALTA AS A REMOTE i-GAMING HUB

First to introduce Remote Gaming Regulations, Malta's irreproachable legal and administrative frame-work is only strengthened by the advantages afforded to it by its small size: a proverbial microchip in a market of lumbering giants.

## REMOTE GAMING OPERATIONS

The Remote Gaming Regulations regulate all aspects of remote gaming activities. Issued for five years and renewable thereafter, there are four main Classes of remote gaming licenses available:

**Class 1:** Operators who partake in the gaming risk based on games based on repetitive events (Random Number Generators) e.g. Casino / Lotteries / Slots / Arcade Games / Bingo;

**Class 2:** Operators who partake in gaming risk on markets based on singular events (betting) e.g. Sports Betting;

**Class 3:** Operators who promote games and in return get a commission in a P2P transaction. Typically includes multiplayer games and betting exchanges such as Poker rooms, Poker tournaments etc;

**Class 4:** Operators who run a software platform; to host the service of any of the above classes. Such operators are not involved in player management functions. They merely provide a host platform from which other licensees can operate.
